

ORDINANCE NO. 7649

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO CONTRACT FOR PAINTING OF PAVEMENT MARKINGS, PROJECT NO. 14-07

Whereas, Bids were properly solicited to supply labor, equipment, fuel and materials to refresh center lines, edge lines, lane lines and channel lines on public streets throughout the city in accordance with plans and material specifications on file as Engineering Division Project No. 14-07 and A & A Safety, Inc. of Amelia, Ohio, submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid in the amount of \$42,735.17;

Now therefore, be it enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Defiance, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The City Administrator is authorized to award a contract to A & A Safety, Inc. to apply pavement markings conforming to the plans and specifications established by the solicitation and terms and conditions of performance established by the accepted bid.

SECTION 2: The Finance Director is directed to pay costs of the contract authorized by Section 1 from 2014 budgetary line item: 202-901-5-2-980-882.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all legislative acts pertaining or relating to the enactment of this Ordinance were taken in public session and that all deliberations of Council, including all deliberations of the committees of Council, that affected or influenced any such legislative act, were conducted in public session duly convened in accordance with law.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary to preserve the health and safety of the community for the reason that clearly visible pavement markings are essential to the regulation of traffic and the work authorized by this Ordinance must begin promptly to assure completion prior to the onset of winter conditions that would prevent paint from adhering to asphalt. As such, this Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage by an affirmative vote of not less than 5 Members of Council and approval of the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. 7650

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A CONTRACT TO BERGREN AND ASSOCIATES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, a water quality study performed by Poggemeyer Design Group, Inc. recommended installation aeration equipment in the Water Treatment Plant to inhibit formation of Trihalomethanes and provision was made for payment of estimated project costs in the 2014 annual budget; and,

WHEREAS, designs and specifications to aerate Clearwell #4 have been approved by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and a contract has been awarded to R.G. Zachrich Construction to install piping and appurtenances to deliver compressed air to the clearwell; and,

WHEREAS, bids to supply the required blowers and variable frequency drives were properly solicited and Bergren and Associates submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid in the amount of \$47,281.00;

Now therefore, be it enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Defiance, Ohio, that:

Section 1: The City Administrator is authorized to award a contract to Bergren and Associates to supply two blowers and variable frequency drives conforming to the specifications established by the solicitation and accepted bid and at the bid price of \$47,281.00.

Section 2: The Finance Director is authorized to pay the contract price from appropriated funds allocated to the project by Line 591-537-5-2-980-880 of the 2014 annual budget.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all legislative actions pertaining to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in Public Session and that all deliberations that affected or influenced any such legislative act, including all deliberations in Committee, were conducted in Public Session duly convened in accordance with law.

Section 4: This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary to preserve the health of the community for the reason that Trihalomethanes have been identified as a potential threat to human health necessitating that reduction strategies be implemented as quickly as possible to comply with regulatory requirements. As such, this Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage by an affirmative vote of not less than 5 Members of Council and approval of the Mayor.
