

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Defiance Police Auxiliary had a very successful year in 2003, volunteering 1,187 hours to the City of Defiance. They also helped to cover projecting for full time officers by working an additional 515.5 hours. The hours that were volunteered this year reflect a decrease from last years 1,948 hours. This was largely due in part to manpower. The amount of projecting hours also decreased from last years 768 hours due to the number of hours and projects that were made available to the Auxiliary.

The Police Auxiliary donated hours in such areas as sporting events, holiday parades, the 4th of July fireworks, and in-service training. The Auxiliary also helped to assist full time officers with their duties and also area businesses with duties such as security, safety, training, and fingerprinting.

The Police Auxiliary began 2003 with 12 members, 3 short of a full roster, which was also the membership number at the end of the year. The membership dropped to 11 in March and remained there until October when another member was accepted. The Auxiliary is currently in the process of filling 3 more positions to bring the roster to 15 members strong.

During the course of the year in 2003, the Auxiliary endured a lack of manpower that made donating and working projecting hours difficult. The membership dropped to 11 in March with the resignation of one its members due to personal reasons. The Auxiliary was also short another member for approximately 3 months due to being called in for active duty. All members of the Auxiliary worked extremely hard during 2003 to donate hours to the city and community and to help full time officers cover projecting even though they were shorthanded throughout the year.

Attached is a breakdown of officers' hours by activity. The headings: **PATROL, TRAINING, PAID PROJECTS, PUBLIC RELATIONS, and ADMINISTRATION & MEETINGS** are defined as follows:

PATROL- is assisting full time officers with their duties. This includes but is not limited to: traffic stops, complaints, accidents, traffic and crowd control, and court appearances. These are all non-paid hours.

TRAINING- is any schooling the officer may take to further enhance his or her

knowledge of law enforcement or to update their current standards. The most common training for an Auxiliary Officer is the Basic Police Officer Course.


PAID PROJECTS- are all hours that an Auxiliary Officer works for compensation. These hours are first offered to the full time officers and then to the Auxiliary. Examples of projects include security at the mall, at special school events, and at sporting events.

PUBLIC RELATIONS- is any detail that makes the officer visible in the community. This includes such details as manning information booths at the mall, fingerprinting children, and providing security at special events and parades for no monetary compensation.

ADMINISTRATION & MEETINGS- includes time spent in monthly or special meetings. This also includes special committees and report preparation.

The Defiance Police Auxiliary is honored to have served the city and community of Defiance in 2003 and is looking forward to serving in 2004 and beyond.
