
This letter is a summarization of the Defiance Police Departments community policing activities for the year 2004. As you are well aware 2004 was not the best year for the City of Defiance and the Defiance Police Department due to financial instability and the cut backs in personnel endured by the police department. As a result, the Defiance Police Department had to shift manpower around and cut several of its more important programs. Our Community Relations Officer Roy MacDonald had to be shifted back to regular shift duties due to manpower shortages which meant that the following programs had to be shut down: the Gang Resistance Education and Training Program, the Scream, Run and Tell Program, the Defiance Junior Police Academy, and the Citizen's Police Academy.

But even with the strenuous times the officers of the Defiance Police Department have managed to maintain some of its programs thanks to the officers who know how important they are to the community. We continue to support the Defiance Crime Stoppers Program, the Defiance County Senior Triad, and the Third Grade Seatbelt Program. We also still maintain the Bicycle Patrol which has been hurt by officers being transferred into other law enforcement areas, but an area in which we hope to train several new officers for 2005. The department's canine program is currently on hold due to the handler being called to active duty in the military. Just as soon as he returns from the military the program will once again become operational.

I think you can plainly see that even though this has been a year of change and one that has been very trying due to lack of personnel that the officers of the Defiance Police Department are still maintaining and building relationships with our community. They continue to look for new and innovative ways to make themselves more efficient and effective while performing their duties. As the economy and the city progresses in the future we will look to bring back some or all of the programs which had to be cut from the department.

The Officers of the Defiance Police Department once again look forward to working with the citizens, the city administration and the city council to continue to make Defiance "A Great Place to Live." We would like to thank everyone for the opportunity to serve this community and encourage everyone to stop in anytime, our doors are always open.

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

The Defiance Police Auxiliary had a very successful year in 2004 volunteering 1740.5 hours to the City of Defiance. The Auxiliary also helped cover projecting for full time officers by working an additional 209 hours. The hours that were volunteered this year reflect an increase from last years 1,187 hours. The Auxiliary only carried 11 members for the majority of 2004 versus 13 members in 2003. The amount of projecting hours however decreased from last years 515.5 hours due to the number of hours and projects made available to the Auxiliary.

The Police Auxiliary donated hours in areas such as sporting events, holiday parades, the Fourth of July Fireworks event, Shop with a Cop and in-service training. The Auxiliary also assisted full time officers with their general duties and also area businesses with duties such as security, safety, training and fingerprinting.

The Police Auxiliary began 2004 with 13 members, 2 short of the allowed 15 member roster. Two members resigned in the early part of the year due to personal time constraints. A third member has also been on active military duty for the majority of the year. For these reasons, the Auxiliary operated the majority part of the year with 10 members and was still able to volunteer 157 more hours to the community that in 2003. The Auxiliary ended 2004 with 11 members and is currently in the process of filling 4 more positions to become fully staffed.
