Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

This letter is a summarization of the Defiance Police Departments policing activities for the year 2005. We worked for most of the year five officers short with four due to attrition and one due to being called to active duty with our countries armed forces. As a result of working for most of the year with the shortage we have had to find alternative ways of providing the same services that our community has been accustomed to in the past. The good news is that with the passage of the additional income tax in May of 2005 that we have been able to hire back two of the officers slots lost due to attrition and the officer called to active duty has returned and is back to work with the department.

Even with the strenuous times in 2005 the department has been able to maintain some of its programs lost when the cut backs in the city occurred. We have been able to continue to work with the Defiance/Paulding County Crime Stoppers Program, the Defiance County Senior Triad and the Third Grade Seatbelt Program. We have also been able to maintain the departments bicycle patrol program and even added an additional officer during 2005. In looking toward 2006 we hope to add at least two more officer's to our department's bike patrol program. The department's canine unit Zeus has been redeployed with the return of his handler Sgt. Steve Waldron from active duty.

We are still a department in transition but I think that we are on the right track and look to keep making strides in 2006. We do not look to restore any of the programs lost due to attrition in 2006 but will continue to keep moving in a positive direction and to maintain the excellent services that we have delivered in the past. We have to learn to walk again before we will be able to run and that will take a little time.

The Officer's of the Defiance Police Department once again look forward to working with the administration, city council and the citizens of Defiance to continue to make Defiance, "A Great Place to Live." We would like to thank the community for the opportunity to serve and encourage all to stop in anytime, our doors all always open.



Dear Ladies and Gentleman:

The Defiance Police Auxiliary had a very good year volunteering 1001.5 hours to the City of Defiance and working an additional 228 hours of projecting to cover for full time officers. This reflects a decrease in the number of hours volunteered from last year's numbers and the projecting hours has shown a decrease from last year as well. This was due to a loss of officers through retirement, active military duty, and health issues.

The Police Auxiliary donated hours in areas such as sporting events, holiday parades, the 4th of July Fireworks event, and in-service training. They also assisted full time officers with their general duties and also area businesses with duties such as security, safety, training and fingerprinting.

The Police Auxiliary began 2005 with 11 members, 4 short of the allowed 15 member roster. One officer was active in the military from January to September. Another officer was off from March through December for maternity leave. The Auxiliary also lost another officer in August due to an injury and another officer in November through retirement. For these reasons, the Auxiliary operated much of the year with 7 members. This accounted for the significant decrease in assistance from the Auxiliary for 2005. The Auxiliary ended the year with 10 officers, 2 of which are still currently on medical leave. The Auxiliary is currently in the process of reviewing applications, conducting background checks and interviewing candidates to fill the 5 vacancies in the roster.

Attached is a breakdown of officers' hours by activity. The headings; PATROL, TRAINING, PAID PROJECTS, PUBLIC RELATIONS, and ADMINISTRATION & MEETINGS are defined as follows:

PATROL- assisting full time officers with their duties. This includes, but is not limited to: traffic stops, complaints, accidents, traffic and crowd control, and court appearances. These are all non-paid hours.

PAID PROJECTS- all hours that an Auxiliary officer works for compensation. These hours are

first offered to the full time officers and then to members of the Auxiliary. Examples of projecting include security at the mall, special school events, and sporting events.

TRAINING- any schooling the officer may take to further enhance his or her knowledge of law enforcement or to update their current standards. The most common training for an Auxiliary Officer is the Basic Peace Officer Training and qualification to carry a firearm.

PUBLIC RELATIONS- any detail that makes the officer visible in the community. This includes details such as manning information booths at the mall, fingerprinting children, and providing security at special events and parades.

ADMINISTRATION & MEETINGS- includes time spent in monthly or special meetings. This also includes special committees and report preparation.
