Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

This yearly report is a summarization of the Defiance Police Department's policing activities for the year 2008. The Department had some changes in leadership this year with the retirement of Chief Norman Walker. I was promoted in April to Chief of Police after serving 14 years as the Assistant Chief of Police. Lieutenant Jeff Mack was promoted to Assistant Chief of Police, Sergeant Todd Shafer was promoted to Lieutenant, and Patrolman Tobie Delaney was promoted to Sergeant in August. A vacancy was created in the patrolman rank due to the promotions and is not scheduled to be replaced because of the poor economy. Patrolman Matt Skiver has served the entire year in the United States Army Reserve in Iraq and is tentatively scheduled to return in January of 2009. The Department currently stands two officers below what is authorized by ordinance.

I think you will find that the officers of the police department were busy and very active throughout 2008. We continue to offer an active bicycle patrol and look to continue the philosophy of community policing. The department's canine unit, Sgt. Steve Waldron and his partner Zeus, have continued to provide excellent services not only to the city but to surrounding jurisdictions as well. The Defiance Police Department continues to be a member of the Multi Area Narcotics Task Force with one officer assigned to full time duties with the task force fighting drugs.

We continue to be a very young department still in transition and will continue to be so in 2009. Overall, youth is not a bad thing. We have officers with military backgrounds and college degrees and they bring experience, intelligence and new ideas to the table. As we continue through the transition we will move in a positive direction and provide our city with the best law enforcement possible.

The officers of the Defiance Police Department once again look forward to working with the City Administration, City Council and the citizen's of Defiance to continue to make Defiance, "A Great Place to Live". We would like to thank the community for the opportunity to serve and encourage all to stop in anytime. Our doors are always open.

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Defiance Police Auxiliary had a good year volunteering 2056.25 hours to the City of Defiance and working an additional 93.25 hours of projecting to cover for full time officers. This reflects a decrease in the number of hours volunteered from last year and the projecting hours has shown a decrease from last year as well.

The Police Auxiliary donated hours in areas such as sporting events, holiday parades, the 4th of July Fireworks event, and in-service training. They also assisted full time officers with their general duties and also area businesses with duties such as security, safety and training.

The Police Auxiliary began 2008 with an 11 member roster with three members on medical leave. One member was on leave for three months, another for four months, and the last for five months. The Auxiliary also lost one member, Tony Imber, to a full time law enforcement position with the Defiance Police Department in late December of 2007. Another member, Tyson Waldron, has been on current active military duty since January of 2008 and is scheduled to return in February of this year. Daniel Bentancur has also been on leave in the months of February, June, August and September for military assignments. Two of our newest members, Chelsey Morris and Terrence Carder were enrolled in Peace Officers Training through May. For these reasons, the Auxiliary operated over half of the year with 8 officers and ended the year with 10.

Attached is a breakdown of officers' hours by activity. The headings; PATROL, TRAINING, PAID PROJECTS, PUBLIC RELATIONS, and ADMINISTRATION & MEETINGS are defined as follows:

PATROL- assisting full time officers with their duties. This includes, but is not limited to: traffic stops, complaints, accidents, traffic and crowd control, and court appearances. These are all non-paid hours.


PAID PROJECTS- all hours that an Auxiliary officer works for compensation. These hours are first offered to the full time officers and then to members of the Auxiliary. Examples of projecting include security at the mall, special school events, and sporting events.

TRAINING- any schooling the officer may take to further enhance his or her knowledge of law enforcement or to update their current standards. The most common training for an Auxiliary Officer is the Basic Peace Officer Training and qualification to carry a firearm.

PUBLIC RELATIONS- any detail that makes the officer visible in the community. This includes details such as manning information booths at the mall, fingerprinting children, and providing security at special events and parades.

ADMINISTRATION & MEETINGS- includes time spent in monthly or special meetings. This also includes special committees and report preparation.
