This yearly report is a summarization of the Defiance Police Department's policing activities for the year 2009. We began the year two officers down from authorized strength due to one position not being filled from promotions in 2008. Early in the year we lost another patrolman who took a position with another department. That position was also not filled due to budget constraints. The Department currently stands three officers below what is authorized by ordinance.

I think you will find that the officers of the police department were busy and very active throughout 2009. We continue to offer an active bicycle patrol and look to continue the philosophy of community policing. Our department K-9 Unit had a change in personnel with the retirement of K-9 Zeus. A new K-9 unit was formed with the purchase of K-9 Rex and selection of Ptl. Mitch McClure as his handler. The K-9 unit did an excellent job serving the City of Defiance and surrounding jurisdictions the second half of 2009. The Defiance Police Department continues to be a member of the Multi Area Narcotics Task Force with one officer assigned to full time duties fighting drugs.

With no new officers hired in 2009 and working somewhat short handed, officers have worked hard to continue to provide great service. We have officers with military backgrounds and college degrees, older officers and young officers. This diverse group will continue to move the department in a positive direction and provide our city with the best law enforcement possible.

The officers of the Defiance Police Department once again look forward to working with the City Administration, City Council and the citizens of Defiance to continue to make Defiance, "A Great Place to Live". We would like to thank the community for the opportunity to serve and encourage all to stop in anytime. Our doors are always open.

Dear Gentlemen,

The Defiance Police Auxiliary saw a great deal of turnover in 2009. After starting the year with ten members, we lost three, including one certified officer, Robin Bowen. Two of the members, Dan Bentancur and Tyson Waldron were on active duty with the Air Force and Army respectively for most of the year. Another member, Robert Flory was on extended sick leave.

In 2009 we added seven members during the second half of the year, one of those, Stanley Hartzell having his peace officer certification. Two of our new members, Jason Hoffman and Dan Bostelman started the basic peace officer training in August of 2009. Jason is attending classes at Northwest State Community College in the evenings. Dan is attending full time at Owens Community College. Each of these members will take a minimum of 580 hours of instruction in such things as firearms, search and seizure, laws of arrest, Domestic Violence Protocol, and many other subjects.

Attached is a full roster of members and a summary of hours donated or worked.

To understand the breakdown of hours by activity the following defines each category:

PATROL – assisting full time officers of the department on routine patrol. This includes, but is not limited to; assisting on traffic stops, complaints, accidents, traffic and crowd control, and court appearances, and report writing. These are all hours volunteered by the members.

PAID PROJECTING – all hours that an auxiliary officer works for compensation. These hours are first offered to full time officers. In the event a request is unfulfilled by regular officers auxiliary officers may fill in. Examples of these would be security at the Northtowne Mall, football and basketball games, and special events in the community such as the GOBA stopover and the Triathlon this past summer.

TRAINING – any schooling the officer may attend to further their knowledge of law enforcement or update current standards. Certified Officers are required to fulfill the same firearms qualification as well as receive some type of update training as their full time counterparts. Further, we are encouraging non certified members to attend training when it is provided locally and free of charge to the department or Auxiliary. An example of this would be Domestic Violence related update training that is sponsored by the Family Justice Center and is held at The Defiance College.

PUBLIC RELATIONS – any detail that make the officer visible in the community. This includes details such as manning information booths at the mall, fingerprinting children for various safety related events such as Boo Town (before the Lions Club Parade) and providing security at special events and parades, such as the Lions Club Parade, 4th of July Fireworks, and the Defiance Rib Fest.

ADMINISTRATION AND MEETINGS – includes time spent in monthly or special meetings and for the officers of the organization, preparation time for the treasurer and secretary.
