REF: Defiance Police Division – Detective Bureau Year End Report

Chief Tobias,

2010 was a successful year for the Detective Bureau as a total of 256 cases were worked by Detectives with 196 of those cases being cleared. The clearance of those cases resulted in the recovery of property and money totaling \$111,859.44. Not included in the total number of cases worked and cleared are the innumerable times that Detectives assist, advise or review cases.

The Mission of the Detective Bureau continues to be to serve the Patrol Division with superior investigative and forensic services to support the greater Mission of the Defiance Police Division. Our services to the Patrol Division are the investigation of cases, evidence processing, interview assistance and case review. The addition of Clerk Holman to the property room operation helped alleviate a backlog and expedite the return of property to citizens.

The Detective Bureau also continues to serve the citizens of the city of Defiance by not only investigating cases, but also giving talks, presentations and training to local groups and businesses. Just a few examples are as follows: several fingerprinting classes were given to the Boy Scouts attending the summer camp at Camp Lakota, a forensic and evidence collection demonstration was presented to several Girl Scouts troops, Detective Richards assisted the Defiance College in a forensic science practical exercise and bank robbery response training was provided to several local financial institutions.

Please find attached the year end reports as well as the Uniform Crime Report (UCR) reportable crimes.

Detective Kinner, Detective Richards, Clerk Holman and I look forward to serving the Defiance Police Division and the citizens of Defiance to continue to make Defiance a Great Place to Live.

Gentlemen,

The Defiance Police Auxiliary saw a stable year in 2010. We filled the roster in 2009, however, we still had two of the members, Dan Bentancur and Tyson Waldron on active duty with the Air Force and Army respectively for most of the year. Another member, Robert Flory returned from extended sick leave.

Two of our newer members, Jason Hoffman and Dan Bostelman finished basic peace officer training and received their state certification. Each of these members received a minimum of 580 hours of instruction in such things as firearms, search and seizure, laws of arrest, Domestic Violence Protocol, and many other subjects. Another member, Justin Ruffer began Basic School at Northwest State Community College. He will graduate in 2011.

Attached is a full roster of members and a summary of hours donated or worked.

To understand the breakdown of hours by activity the following defines each category:

PATROL – assisting full time officers of the department on routine patrol. This includes, but is not limited to; assisting on traffic stops, complaints, accidents, traffic and crowd control, and court appearances, and report writing. These are all hours volunteered by the members.

PAID PROJECTING – all hours that an auxiliary officer works for compensation. These hours are first offered to full time officers. In the event a request is unfulfilled by regular officers auxiliary officers may fill in. Examples of these would be security at the Northtowne Mall, football and basketball games, and special events in the community such as the GOBA stopover and the Triathlon this past summer.

TRAINING – any schooling the officer may attend to further their knowledge of law enforcement or update current standards. Certified Officers are required to fulfill the

when it is provided locally and free of charge to the department or Auxiliary. An example of this would be Domestic Violence related update training that is sponsored by the Family Justice Center and is held at The Defiance College.

PUBLIC RELATIONS – any detail that make the officer visible in the community. This includes details such as manning information booths at the mall, fingerprinting children for various safety related events such as Boo Town (before the Lions Club Parade) and providing security at special events and parades, such as the Lions Club Parade, 4th of July Fireworks, and the Defiance Rib Fest.

ADMINISTRATION AND MEETINGS – includes time spent in monthly or special meetings and for the officers of the organization, preparation time for the treasurer and secretary.



With the assignment of one officer to the MAN Unit in the 2009, 2010 fiscal years you will see by the stats that the productivity of this officer has made Defiance City a "great place to live" and to raise our children.

These stats however, do not tell the entire story of what each officer of the Multi Area Narcotic Task Force, contributes to the whole picture of North West Ohio. With the MAN Unit covering Williams, Defiance, and Putnam Counties along with the City of Defiance, and Bryan. This multi- jurisdictional task force tends to target mid-to upper level drug trafficking and organized criminal activity for which it would be difficult for any one jurisdiction to build a case. In this way, they are not duplicative of individual agencies, but are a critical addition to local law enforcement. These officers work as a collaborative group, and assist local law enforcement with the use of specialized equipment and surveillance techniques.

As National statics have shown there is a direct relationship with the narcotic trade to our national security both foreign and domestic. This also relates to local crime statistics. Most of our local thefts, assaults, burglary relate to the defendant and their dependency of a controlled substance. Their need to purchase these substances create the motive to commit crime. Without the officer assigned to the Multi Area Narcotics Task Force, these crime stats for the City of Defiance area are certain to rise.
