We are working to replace these officers and currently have one officer in the Ohio Peace Officers Training Academy and are hoping to hire two more officers to bring us back to 17 patrolmen. We also lost the service of Ptl. Matt Skiver who is currently serving in the Army National Guard overseas.

I think you will find that the officers of the police department were busy and very active throughout 2011. We continue to offer an active bicycle patrol and look to continue the philosophy of community policing. K-9 Rex and handler Ptl. Mitch McClure did an excellent job serving the City of Defiance and surrounding jurisdictions in 2011. The Defiance Police Department continues to be a member of the Multi Area Narcotics Task Force with one officer assigned to full time duties fighting drugs. Ptl. Chris Yocum showed an interest in working with kids and community policing activities and works hard to fit programs and speaking engagements into his regular schedule.

With the department working short handed in 2011, officers have strived to continue to provide great service. We have officers with military backgrounds and college degrees, older officers and young officers. This diverse group will continue to move the department in a positive direction and provide our city with the best law enforcement possible.

The officers of the Defiance Police Department once again look forward to working with the City Administration, City Council and the citizen's of Defiance to continue to make Defiance, "A Great Place to Live". We would like to thank the community for the opportunity to serve and encourage all to stop in anytime. Our doors are always open.

Chief Tobias,

2011 was another successful year for the Detective Bureau as a total 241 case were worked by Detectives with a total of 186 of those cases cleared. The clearance of those cases resulted in the recovery of an estimated \$60,000 in currency and property, but does not include court ordered restitution to victims. Of course, as with previous years, the cases worked is a far greater number as Detectives often consult, advise, assist and review cases that are not charted on our statistics report.

The Detective Bureau personnel not only investigate cases and assist the Road Patrol operation with support but we continued a tradition of service by presenting training, talks and other presentations to area schools, civic groups, and business. We continued the forensic and police career presentation to the Camp Lakota Boy Scout Troop, robbery prevention and response training to several local financial institutions and numerous tours of the Division Headquarters.

There has been a smooth transition to Detective Sergeant Campbell as he has assumed command of the Detective Bureau, but know that along with Detective Sergeant Campbell, Detective Richards, and Clerk Holman, I look forward to serving the Defiance Police Division, the City of Defiance and the public to continue to make Defiance A Great Place to Live.

For the year 2011, K9 Rex and I had approx. 111 K9 Jobs/assists.
Agencies assisted by K9 Rex were as follows:

- *The Ohio State Highway Patrol*

- *Defiance County Sheriff's Office*
- *Napoleon Police Dept.*
- *Hicksville Police Dept.*
- *Henry County Sheriff's Office*

K9 Rex also completed numerous public relations events and K9 Demos through out the year. These are important to show the citizens what K9's do on a daily basis and how they work. It is also important to show that K9's are not "mean or vicious dogs" but trained tools.

At the end of some of our demos, children would often play and throw a ball for K9 Rex and pet him. We made trips to elementary schools, the YMCA, Safety towns, and summer festivals.

K9 Rex was responsible for approx. 25 misdemeanor narcotic arrests/charges, resulting from our traffic stops or from assisting other officers/agencies. K9 Rex was also responsible for 3 felony drug arrests/charges, with the largest seizure being 27.6 grams of powder cocaine and crack cocaine.

Narcotics/Pills seized by K9 Rex in 2011 included: Heroin, cocaine, crack cocaine, marijuana, spice, k2, bath salts, meloxicam, hydrocodone, alprazolam, and liquid lidocaine.

In 2011 K9 Rex also recovered evidence during tracks from Breaking and Entering complaints and burglaries.

K9 Rex made 4 apprehensions, and a track in Hicksville, Ohio resulted in charges on a juvenile for criminal damaging and other related charges. K9 Rex was also involved in a track and apprehension of subjects who were breaking into cars in and around Browns Bakers. Three suspects were charged and property was recovered for the victims. K9 Rex also had one "recall" in 2011 (K9 called off of fleeing subject before biting).

Gentlemen,

The Defiance Police Auxiliary saw a stable year in 2011. We filled the roster in 2009; however, we still had two of the members, Dan Bentancur and Tyson Waldron on active duty with the Air Force and Army respectively for most of the year. Another member, Robert Flory returned from extended sick leave.

Two of our newer members, Dan Bostelman and Justin Ruffer left us for full time employment as police officers in Bryan and Napoleon. We have not yet replaced them as we have been working on an updated training manual for our members.

We have also encouraged our members to be more involved by attending in service training that is offered in the area and in house by our own in service trainers. Several of our members have taken up the challenge by attending Sexual Assault Response Team training that will allow them to assist the regular officers with Sexual Assault investigations when needed or requested. They have also attended some of the Response to Resistance training officered monthly.

Attached is a breakdown of hours volunteered by the members of the Defiance Police Auxiliary. To understand the breakdown of hours by activity the following defines each category:

PATROL – assisting full time officers of the department on routine patrol. This includes, but is not limited to; assisting on traffic stops, complaints, accidents, traffic and crowd control, and court appearances, and report writing. These are all hours volunteered by the members.

PAID PROJECTING – all hours that an auxiliary officer works for compensation. These hours are first offered to full time officers. In the event a request is unfulfilled by regular

officers auxiliary officers may fill in. Examples of these would be security at the Northtowne Mall, football and basketball games, and special events in the community such as the GOBA stopover and the Triathlon this past summer.

TRAINING – any schooling the officer may attend to further their knowledge of law enforcement or update current standards. Certified Officers are required to fulfill the same firearms qualification as well as receive some type of update training as their full time counterparts. Further, we are encouraging non certified members to attend training when it is provided locally and free of charge to the department or auxiliary. An example of this would be Domestic Violence related update training that is sponsored by the Family Justice Center and is held at The Defiance College.

PUBLIC RELATIONS – any detail that make the officer visible in the community. This includes details such as manning information booths at the mall, fingerprinting children for various safety related events such as Boo Town (before the Lions Club Parade) and providing security at special events and parades, such as the Lions Club Parade, 4th of July Fireworks, and the Defiance Rib Fest.

ADMINISTRATION AND MEETINGS – includes time spent in monthly or special meetings and for the officers of the organization, preparation time for the treasurer and secretary.
